TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, TEXAS

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED OFFICERS, holding an election on the 6th day of April, 1974, at the CIVIC CENTER in said City, to determine whether the governing body of the City shall be authorized to issue its bonds for the purpose set forth in the proposition submitted at said election, DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT:

(i) In conformity with the resolution and order calling the election, two separate voting machines were provided at the polling place to which this set of returns relate,

(ii) All resident qualified electors who owned taxable property in the City and who had duly rendered the same on the tax rolls of the City were permitted to vote on the voting machine designated for their ballots and the ballots cast on such machine are recorded or tabulated in Column (1) hereinafter set forth,

(iii) All resident qualified electors (who were otherwise qualified but did not own taxable property which had been duly rendered for taxation on the tax rolls of the City) were permitted to vote on the machine designated for their ballots, and the ballots cast on such machine are recorded or tabulated in Column (2) hereinafter set forth, and

(iv) The total of the votes cast by the resident qualified electors (including those who own taxable property which has been duly rendered for taxation on the tax rolls of the City) being the total of Columns (1) and (2), is set forth in Column (3), and that on the proposition the following votes were cast:

Instructions for Tally of Absentee Ballots

1. One of the Judges of election, in the presence of the election officers shall, between the hours of 2 p.m. and 3 p.m., open the carrier envelopes.
2. Announce each and every one of the elector's names and compare the signature upon the applications with the affidavits upon the ballot envelopes.
3. In the presence of watchers, if any, open the ballot envelopes and take out the ballot without permitting same to be unfolded or examined.
4. Presiding officer shall endorse ballots, enter name of elector in poll list, number same and deposit in "Absentee Ballot Box."
5. After all such absentee ballots have been deposited in such absentee ballot box, the officers of such election shall designate such of their number as will not interfere with uninterrupted use of voting machines as provided for in Section 107 of this Act.
6. Absentee voting and the count of absentee ballots is conducted as outlined under sub sec. 7 of Section 79 and Section 107 Texas Election Laws.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER by the City Council of the City of Webster, Texas, calling a bond election to be held within said City, making provision for the conduct of the election and other provisions incident and related to the purpose of this resolution and order.

WHEREAS, this City Council deems it advisable to call a bond election for the purpose hereinafter mentioned; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That an election be held on the 6th day of April, 1974, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption hereof, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted.

"SHALL the City Council of the City of Webster, Texas, be authorized to issue

SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS
(\$ 65,000.00) general obligation bonds of said City for the purpose of constructing a fire station building in and for said City, said bonds to mature serially over a period of years not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance; and to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

SECTION 2 That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the V.A.T.S. Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid proposition which shall be set forth in substantially the following form.

"THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 65,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
FIRE STATION BONDS"

Voting machines shall be used in the election except paper ballots shall be used for absentee voting, utilizing the aforesaid proposition. On such paper ballots, the word "FOR" and beneath it the word "AGAINST" shall be made to appear on the left of the proposition. A square shall be printed on the left of each of the words "FOR" and "AGAINST", and each elector shall place an "X" in the square beside the statement indicating the way he wishes to vote.

SECTION 3. That said election shall be held at the CIVIC CENTER in said City, and the entire City shall constitute one election precinct for said election.

SECTION 4. That the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of the election:

L.C. MATSON

Presiding Judge

CLARA F. MATSON

Alternate Presiding Judge

The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) nor more than three (3) qualified clerks to serve and assist in holding said election, provided that if the Presiding Judge herein appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of the clerks.

On election day the polls shall be open from 7.00 A. M. to 7 00 P. M.

Absentee voting shall be conducted at the City Secretary's office in the City Hall, in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Chapter 5.

SECTION 5. All resident qualified electors of the City, including those who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be permitted to vote at said election. That on election day, two separate voting machines shall be provided at the polling place. On one voting machine only resident qualified electors who own taxable property and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be allowed to vote. On the other machine all resident qualified electors (who are otherwise qualified but do not own taxable property which has been duly rendered for taxation) shall be allowed to vote. The votes cast on each voting machine shall be recorded, returned, and canvassed in such manner as will reflect separately the votes cast by the qualified electors who own taxable property and who have duly rendered the same for taxation from the votes cast by all qualified electors (including those who own taxable property and who have duly rendered the same for taxation) Additional voting machines may be provided at the polling place (in addition to the minimum number of two) and the presiding judge shall take such action as may be required to assure ballots are cast, recorded and tabulated in accordance with the foregoing.

SECTION 6 That a substantial copy of this resolution and order shall serve as proper notice of said election. Said notice shall be posted in the election precinct or precincts and at the City Hall not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the date on which said election is to be held, and be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in said City, the first of said publications to be made not less than fourteen (14) full days prior to the date set for said election.
