

All drains in your home flow into the same sewer pipe!




If you notice a serious problem near your home, or on a street, please call the City of Webster at 281-316-3700.

Fats, oils, and grease (F.O.G.) from food waste, scraps and cooking when poured down the drain, clog pipes and cause sewer backups and overflows.

THESE SIMPLE TIPS CAN HELP YOU STAY CLOG-FREE:

- NEVER pour grease or cooking oil down drains or garbage disposals.
- For small amounts of FOG, scrape out or use paper towels to wipe your pans, then discard the FOG or soiled paper towels in your trash can.
- For large amounts of FOG, such as used oil from a turkey fryer, collect cooled oil in a sealable container and take it to the City of Webster Service Center at 855 Magnolia Ave. Webster, TX 77598.
- Use food strainers in kitchen sinks to catch food particles and place them into the garbage or compost.



Not managed properly, F.O.G. can solidify and stick to the sides of your kitchen drains and sewer pipes.


